

## APPENDIX C: ALX ONSITE COMMUNITY GUIDELINES

This policy is reviewed periodically and any updates will be published on this website, effective upon posting. For significant changes, we may also notify you directly or highlight the update prominently.

## 1. Purpose

- 1.1. ALX Onsite Community Guidelines is to establish clear expectations for behavior, conduct, and community interaction within ALX Hub spaces. These guidelines are designed to promote a safe, respectful, and productive environment that supports collaboration, learning, and innovation.
- 1.2. This appendix applies to all learners, staff, facilitators, and visitors participating in any inperson, blended, or live-streaming ALX events or activities held at Hub locations. It outlines the general principles, do's and don'ts, and behavioral standards that align with ALX's core values and Code of Conduct.
- 1.3. These guidelines are binding for all community members present at ALX Hubs, and violations may result in disciplinary actions in accordance with the broader Learner Code of Conduct.

## 2. General Principles

- 2.1. Respect other participants: Treat others the way you want to be treated. Be respectful and courteous towards your fellow members, their work, and their space.
- 2.2. Keep it clean and tidy: Clean up after yourself, keep your workspace clean and tidy, and leave communal spaces the way you found them.
- 2.3. Be mindful of noise levels: Hubs can be noisy, but be aware of your surroundings and keep noise to a minimum when necessary.
- 2.4. Use common areas wisely: Hubs have common areas that are meant to be shared by all members. Be mindful of others and don't monopolize these spaces.
- 2.5. Follow the house rules: Each hub space has its own set of rules. Make sure you understand and follow these rules to maintain a peaceful and harmonious environment.
- 2.6. Don't interrupt other members' work: Hubs are meant to be a productive environment. Be considerate of others and avoid interrupting their work unless absolutely necessary.
- 2.7. Respect confidentiality: Many members of Hubs work on sensitive projects. Respect their privacy and keep confidential information private.
- 2.8. Be collaborative: Hubs are meant to foster collaboration and creativity. Be open to working with others and sharing ideas.
- 2.9. Keep your workspace secure: Keep your personal belongings secure and don't leave valuable items unattended.



2.10. Have fun: Hubs are meant to be enjoyable and inspiring places to work. Have fun and enjoy the community!
